


Independence, Inc. ANNUAL REPORT 2018

**Independence, Inc.** is part of a nationwide network of agencies working to ensure that people with disabilities have opportunities needed to live independently. Having access to affordable healthcare is just one crucial element.

When Ottowa, Kansas resident, **Alise Fears**, received notification that KanCare was terminating her health care policy, she was taken by surprise as this seemed like a big mistake. Alise turned to Independence, Inc. for help in knowing her rights, understanding the KanCare application process, whether or not she still qualified, and how to dispute the cancellation. Staff Johnson, Independence, Inc. Independent Living Specialist, assisted Alise with this process and after a couple of months of working with KanCare, the policy was reinstated and Alise was able to maintain her coverage!



At Independence, Inc., our Youth Employment & Disability Mentoring Day Programs are all about one thing: building relationships to help encourage, foster and grow job-readiness. From skill-building, to resume building to job search and beyond, we are with you every step of the way!

The Independence, Inc. Youth Employment Program (YEP!) helps youth transition from school to the work force with an 80 hour work trial, paid for by Independence, Inc., at a business within our community that provides experience and hands-on training. Ranita Wilks, our YEP! coordinator, offers support in job-readiness skills, resume' building, the application process and more. **Angel Fitzgerald**, YEP! participant, gained valuable experience through his work trial and has now secured employment at Pet World, Lawrence, where he is hard at work at a job he loves!



Our Accessible Housing Program received a \$50,414 community development block grant from the City of Lawrence in August 2018, the highest level of funding we've received since the program began in 1989.

The Independence, Inc. Accessible Housing Program (AHP) assists renters with disabilities and low incomes in Lawrence, Kansas make needed accessibility modifications in their homes. From bathroom and kitchen remodels to wheelchair ramps and hand rails, safe access into and around one's home is an integral part of independent living. **Annie Ross** (pictured with her family) needed assistance with building a wheelchair ramp to her home to accommodate advancing mobility challenges. Independence, Inc. was able to oversee the installation process leaving Annie with safe access to her home.



Braided throughout our mission is the fight for civil and independent living rights for all individuals. It's imperative for people with disabilities to learn how to exercise these rights, use mediation to resolve differences and, when necessary, seek legal recourse. We provide information, referrals, advocacy and support, every step of the way.

Michael Barnett, Lawrence, has been homeless for nearly 4 years, since his housing voucher was revoked in 2015. Our core services staff in collaboration with the the Disability Rights Center, Bert Nash and Lawrence-Douglas County Housing Authority, worked to provide advocacy, support and legal representation as Michael fought for his housing rights. Not only did Michael's case end in a successful hearing with a re-instated housing voucher, but he is now well-positioned for reaching his new goal of permanent housing.



We are in our communities working for access and independence for all. Everyone has the right to equal access to their home, community and the world in which they live. Equal access to recreation is no exception. When Kevin Smith, member of the Independence, Inc. Access Task Force, noticed needed improvements to the fishing dock at Mary's Lake, he did what comes naturally to him - advocacy.

Mary's Lake, a small fishing pond and dock near the Prairie Park Nature Center in Southeast Lawrence, had, over time and changing water levels, developed some accessibility issues which resulted in an unsteady ramp and one too steep for wheelchair users to safely access it. Smith approached the City of Lawrence Parks and Rec Department with the concerns and set a resolution in motion. Thanks to advocacy in action and the conscientious response of the City of Lawrence, the new dock now has a fully accessible ramp (pictured above) for all to enjoy!



Our Information and Referral Service is available to assist anyone needing information on agency or community resources and programs. Staff members are available over the phone or to meet face-to-face in order to problem-solve issues and seek resolution. Referrals are based on need and circumstance and are made to Independence, Inc. staff or, when appropriate, to other community agencies.

Whether in-person, over the phone or visiting us on the web, our skilled staff are available to assist consumers with a broad array of independent living and disability-related needs, questions and issues. From accessibility questions to employment needs, health-care issues to age-related concerns, we have information and assistance you need! In a world where technology is king, staying relevant, increasing visibility and outreach as a non-profit resource center can be a challenge. Adaptability is key. 2018 was a period of growth in our web presence, with more user-friendly, content rich and relevant sites for our consumers. It's in the numbers. 60% of our website users now find us through organic search - What does this mean? We are visible and have a valuable web presence! We are hard at work making sure we are able to respond to the needs of our consumers whether in person or via the web.

- 6,566 users (up 3.34%) and 9,021 sessions (up 7%)
- Avg. of 4 pages viewed per session (up 10.5%)
- Avg. session duration over 5 min. (up 22.25%)
- 12% increase in web visitors who found us through direct search. This means we are gaining visibility in our communities and they know where to find us!
- Our biggest area of virtual growth? Number of users who came to our website through our social media campaigns: 155% growth in pages visited and 155% growth in session duration!



Directing one's own personal care is an essential component of Independent Living and we continually foster and grow our commitment to promoting such self-direction for people with disabilities. Through our Financial Management Services, eligible Medicaid recipients under the HCBS waivers, hire, train and supervise their personal care service worker. We prepare payroll, file returns and taxes and offer information and assistance to anyone involved in the directing of the care.

Susan Krause, Lawrence (above), works long and hard to find, train and retain quality care and assistance for her daughter, Sarah, an adult with Autism. With guidance from Independence, Inc. staff, Susan was able to complete and turn in the necessary forms for Sarah's new Personal Service Care Worker, who has already proven to be a great fit for Sarah! Independence, Inc. will handle all of the paperwork and will process payroll and taxes to ensure a smooth transition for Sarah and her new PCSW!

Even with the long cold winter of 2018, the Independence, Inc. Transportation Team stayed at the top of their game with a 12% increase in rides for the year! From shopping trips to visiting family, and doctor visits to recreation and entertainment, our General Public Transportation, complete with fully accessible vans, will get you where you need to go. We even do out-of-town medical rides to Topeka and Kansas City. Rain, shine, snow or cold, our trained drivers are ready to serve your transportation needs!



2018 unaudited Statement of Revenues and Expenditures


### Sources of Revenue
