#### Independence, Inc. Youth Employment Program, Disability Mentoring Day Changing, Adapting in Response to the New Reality of Life with COVID



With community changes such as the shutdown or hybrid system taking place in schools and educational programs, temporary or even permanent closing of some businesses and ongoing safety precautions related to COVID-19, we are adapting to this new reality by placing on hold, our Youth Employment Program (YEP!) that features work trial opportunities for youth with disabilities, and moving instead towards a safer and more practically-structured program that serves youth transitioning from high school into adulthood.

We are working hard to implement a <u>Youth</u> <u>Transition Program</u> that will take the place of YEP! through 2021, and will serve to remotely and virtually assist youth with disabilities as they transition into adulthood and permanent employment. Resources will include online training opportunities, information and referral, one-on-one support and other assistance as needed.

Rachel Vogelmeier, Independent Living Skills/Peer Counseling Specialist, has been and will continue to collaborate with the Lawrence Public School System transition counselors *[pictured, left]* to brainstorm, plan and build programs that will adapt to the changing needs of high school students with disabilities. We will continue to work with students one-on-one on a case-by-case basis, in a safe manner with social distance and masks. Our primary form of training however will be virtual as we assist youth seeking permanent, paid employment with all of the attributes associated with that goal, including resume building, writing cover letters, applying for jobs etc. Our Disability Mentoring Day event is also on hold until late 2021 when we are looking forward to being past the need for such safety measures that keep us from gathering in person.

#### Forward Thinking: Our Lobby Safety and Security Makeover is Complete



No matter what your personal views on or experience with COVID-19, I think we can all agree on one thing - it has shaken our foundation just a bit and caused us all to do some serious evaluating around safety, health, communication, relationships, work, school and more. For all of us here at Independence, Inc., the health and safety of our consumers, our community and our staff quickly became top priority and our response was swift and well-informed. In addition to following all safety precautions - masks, social distancing, virtual over in-person meetings, extra cleaning and disinfecting etc. - we designed a front lobby makeover to ensure the safety and well-being of visitors and staff well into the future. Our doors remained locked and entrance into the building is determined on a caseby-case basis. Once inside, you'll find a beautifully designed glass safety enclosure separating the lobby from the rest of the building, and accessing staff offices is through a buzz-in system and by appointment only. This protects visitors and staff from any direct contact and limits the number of people in the building. Our protocol remains the same - our building will locked and closed to the public but all staff remain working in the office at full capacity and are available by email, phone, zoom or other virtual platform. Our computer lab is closed and in-person meeting is limited to essential or immediate needs that can't be met over other communication channels. Our equipment loan bank is still open for borrowing and donating and we will meet you at the door with equipment or to receive a donation.

#### Independence, Inc. Service Highlights: Making a Difference

So much unseen goes on behinds the scenes here at Independence, Inc. as we work to support the independent living goals of our consumers. From seemingly small things like getting a tablet into the hands of a consumer who needs telehealth to assisting in extending stable housing for someone at risk of loosing it, the work we do matters. Here's a brief snipit of just a few things we've been working on...



Access to Telehealth A consumer needing telehealth in order to limit possible exposure to COVID-19 through inperson appointments, acquired a new tablet - an essential piece to ongoing health care during the pandemic. Access to federal funding for COVID-related needs allowed us to work with this consumer and get the technology needed to stay safe at home and maintain healthcare.



**Disability Vote Campaign** Independence, Inc. participated in a statewide Center for Independent Living voter registration outreach campaign in October. Core services staff made personal phone calls to our entire consumer base, asking them if they were registered to vote, encouraging them to do so and walking them through the registration process. It was a fabulous day of outreach with many consumers getting registered to vote on November 3rd!



**Stable Housing** A consumer was able to renew and maintain stable housing, avoiding homelessness, with the assistance of an Independence, Inc. staff member who helped this consumer complete the application process to move from the Housing Authority's 2 year Transitional Housing Program to permanent Section 8, rent-subsidized housing.
