Our Core Services

We offer the following Core Services in Wyandotte and Johnson Counties: **Advocacy:** Advocacy services can help you to understand the laws that protect you and approach difficult disputes and other situations with confidence for a positive outcome for all.

Information & Referral: I&R is a vital service, connecting you to community and statewide programs, services, products and opportunities that may benefit someone with a disability.

Independent Living (IL) Skills Training:

Helping to maximize independence and the ability to lead active, engaged and productive lives in the home and the community of your choice.

Peer Support: Peer Support can help someone with a disability navigate life, systems, friendships and other relationships and the community as a whole, as well as assist in gaining confidence and making valuable connections.

Deinstitutionalization: Providing services to assist a person with a disability make the transition from a nursing home or institution back into the community and into the housing of their choice.

Youth Transition: For teens and young adults who desire to transition from high school or part-time employment, to long-term employment, training, technical school or college, including independent living skills training, identifying strengths and interests and taking the next step into adulthood.

Additional Programs & Services

Financial Management Services (FMS) is available to eligible persons with disabilities desiring to self-direct their personal care services under the Kansas Medicaid HCBS Waiver Program. You will hire, train, and supervise your own Personal Care Service Worker while we handle the financial management including preparing payroll, filing returns, and processing unemployment insurance and worker's compensation coverage. The Kansas Work Opportunities Reward Kansans (WORK) program is part of the Working Healthy program and serves ages 16+ with employment supports while allowing continued health care coverage. Through the WORK program, an Independent Living Counselor will help guide you through the employment process and provide supports to help achieve your goals.

Supports and Training for Employing People Successfully (STEPS) is a program through which people with disabilities and/or certain behavioral health conditions may seek a path to employment without loosing Social Security benefits or medical insurance coverage. For those who qualify, services can include: Pre-Vocational Services, Independent Living Skills Training, Personal Assistant Services, Transportation, Supported Employment, Assistive Technology and Community Service Coordination.

Kansas Youth Transition Network

The Kansas Youth Transition Network

was established under a federal grant to provide extended and innovative Youth Transition Services to support the independent living, educational and employment goals of youth with disabilities. We work with youth ages 10 and up within Wyandotte County, to help identify and strengthen interests and talents, to encourage school, peer and community engagement, develop leadership, advocacy, independent living, technical and vocational skills and to identify and present opportunities for higher education, technical training or meaningful employment.
