What is the Kansas Youth Transition Network?

It started with a grant...

In 2023, the Federal Department of Education created the Pathways to Partnership Program - funded by the Disability Innovation Fund (DIF) - to support innovative activities aimed at increasing competitive integrated employment (CIE) for youth and other individuals with disabilities.

The Pathways to Partnership innovative model demonstration project fosters collaborative partnerships between state vocational rehabilitation agencies, state and local educational agencies, and federally funded centers for independent living (that's us!). The grant funding was distributed to state departments of education and the Kansas Youth Transition Network (KYTN) was created under the Kansas Department of Education.

As a network, our common goal is to help individuals with disabilities seamlessly transition to life after high school, preparing them for independent living, further education or technical training, employment and community integration.

Who do we serve?

Through our Kansas Youth Transition Network Program, Independence, Inc. serves youth and young adults with disabilities ages 10-21 in Wyandotte County.

We work within Wyandotte County public schools and the Wyandotte County community as a whole to serve:

- grade school students
- middle school students
- high school students
- virtual school students
- homeschool students and co-ops
- youth within the juvenile correction system
- students in alternative education programs
- recently graduated youth and young adults
- students who have received their GED
- youth experiencing truancy

We offer one-on-one transition training and support for students, IEP or 504 advocacy and support, group training, classroom training and workshops and support for parents, families, caregivers and teachers.
