● help identify and present opportunities to

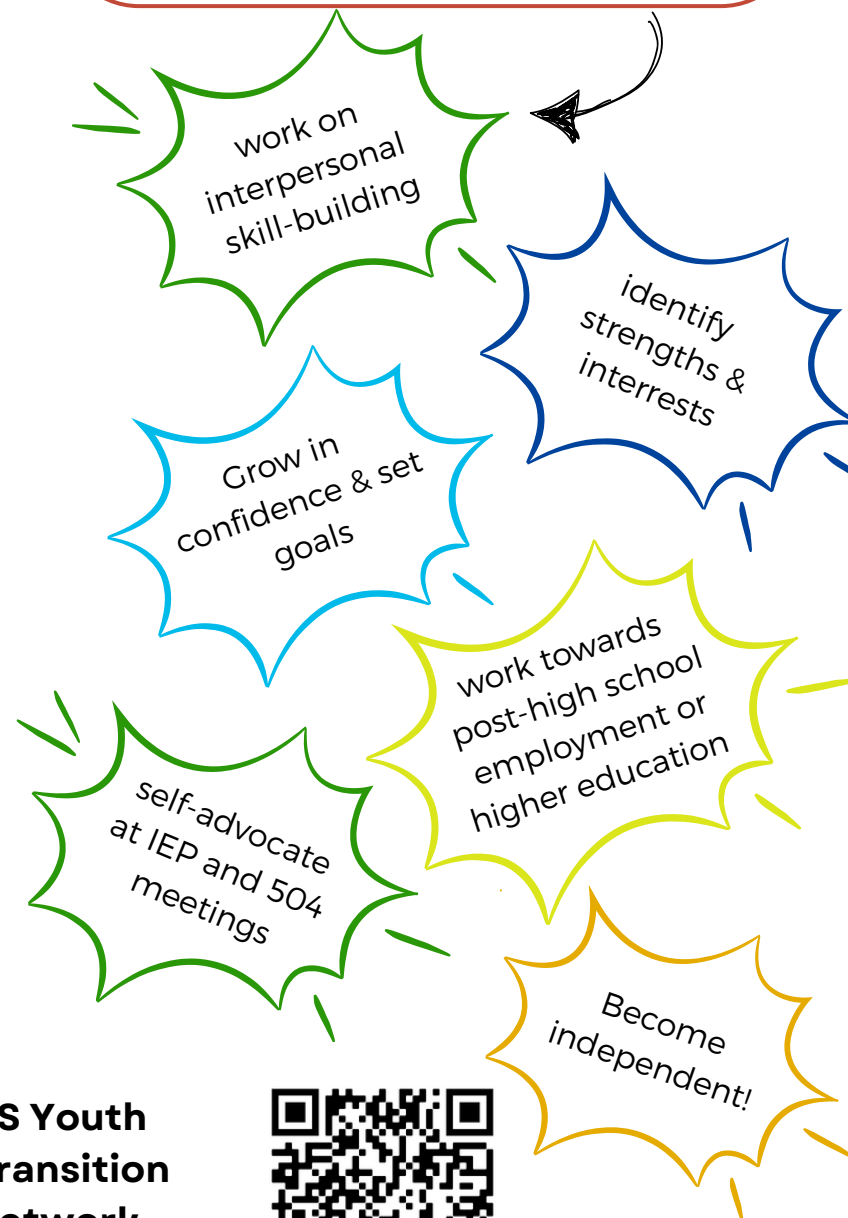
- volunteer or intern

What counts as a disability?

Anything that **YOU** consider a disability!

We are not a medical model and do NOT need any formal documentation of a disability

We work with students who experience:

- high anxiety
- depression
- dyslexia
- sensory perception disorders (lights, sounds, touch etc.)
- Autism
- learning disorders
- ADD/ADHD
- developmental disability
- body movement disorders
- physical disability
- low vision
- Deaf/hard of hearing
- Difficulty with test-taking
- speech difficulties
- Any other experience that creates a barrier to learning and thriving in your educational setting!

Who are we?

Independence, Inc. is a Center for Independent Living (CIL), established in 1978 in Lawrence, KS. Every county in the nation is covered by a CIL and receive funding from state and federal agencies to provide services in our counties. We cover Douglas, Jefferson, Franklin counties and have now expanded into Wyandotte and Johnson counties. Our Kansas Youth Transition Network Program is available to all youth in Wyandotte County.

We provide **FREE** individual, group and in-school/in-class training and workshops. We can meet one-on-one in a student's home, in our office at the Legends, or in school. We can attend IEP or 504 meetings, facilitate peer groups and group trainings and we can partner with service providers you may already be working with like Pre-Ets, Voc Rehab, Project Search and others.
