Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS)

Ages Served: 14-21
We provide career exploration counseling, instruction in self-advocacy, workplace readiness skills training, post-secondary transition counseling, and work-based learning experiences to help students move toward their highest employment potential.

Vocational Rehabilitation

Ages Served: 14 and older

We provide individuals with disabilities vocational counseling and guidance, physical and mental restoration services, training and education to learn new skills, assistive technology, job placement services, supported employment and referrals to other services. VR counselors understand your potential, as well as the barriers you face and will assist you in developing a specific, individualized plan to get a job.
